Career Center Highlights and New Initiatives for the 2023-2024 Academic Year

- Partnered with the Dean of Students and the Community Liaison & Government Relations Assistant to take students to the State Capital in Harrisburg for a KU Advocacy Day to meet with and thank State Legislators for supporting the university and its students. KU students advocated for support of public education and internship funding, were formally recognized on the House floor, and had a brief tour of the state capitol building. Ten students were recipients of a Pennsylvania State Scholarship to be able to attend The Washington Center for either a full-semester internship or week-long academic seminar in Washington, D.C., as well as students serving on the Student Government Board.
- Continued partnerships with the Women's Center and Student Involvement Office to offer a workshop, ElectHer, a non-partisan training session for women on how to run for student government and political office for both KU and area high school students.
- Student usage of the Career Closet significantly increased again from 168 students last year to 298 students this year.
- Mock Interview Mania weeks in both Fall & Spring connected 214 students with 43 local recruiters for on-campus, practice interviews.
- The Career Center, in partnership with the Men's Golf Club and College of Business, hosted its second annual Career Classic fundraising golf event in September at Golden Oaks Golf Club with 128 golfers including recruiters and students.
- Partnered with the Communication Studies and Social Media Strategies academic department to offer their first Career Day of alumni panels educating students on their career options.

Special Events and Services


The CDC coordinates numerous career events for students. Here are just a few:

Career Fairs

- Career Fairs were offered in both virtual and in-person formats for students. With a strong job market, employer registrations remained high.
- Both the Fall & Spring Internship & Job Fairs had their highest attendance post-Covid with 465 and 379 students, respectively.
- Students were offered free headshots by the university photographer.
- A luncheon with the KU faculty was offered for recruiters during the in-person Internship and Job Fairs.

Student Engagement

Student Engagement with the Career Center:

- Highest-ever undergraduate student engagement at 56.24%. Engagement has consistently increased every year since its highest in 2019-20.
- Due to continual decreases in both student and employer/school attendance for the education job fair and grad school fair, both fairs will return to an in-person, on-campus format next academic year.

Career Coaching/Counseling Appointments

Career coaching/counseling appointments continue to climb with over 900 one-on-one meetings this year. Freshmen and Seniors had the most appointments and the top topics of discussion included career choice, academic major choice, internship and job search strategies.

Student attendance at workshops succeeded pre-pandemic levels, while workshop attendance continues to steadily climb.




