- ❖ **Comprehensive Examination (CPCE) data**
The CPCE is a standardized test that is often considered a precursor to taking the required National Counselor Examination for Licensure in Pennsylvania. If a student does not pass the CPCE, the student will work with a faculty member to remediate that area.

CPCE Results Data

Pass Rate	91%
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Students who did not pass on the initial examination all passed the remediation projects with faculty.

The NCE is a standardized test that must be taken to become a Licensed Professional Counselor.

Program Modifications

To meet the CACREP standards, KU has shifted from 2 school counseling programs (one 51 credits and one 60 credit) to one 60 credit program.

KU has expanded their data collection to specific surveys. There now are 4 surveys: Recent Graduate, Alumni, Site Supervisors and Employers.

KU has reviewed and revised all syllabi and rubrics to align with the 2016 standards.
