

Strategic Planning Assessment Report

The Kutztown University 2018-19 Strategic Planning Assessment Report documents an increasing commitment to the expansion of assessment efforts at all levels of the University. This report provides clear evidence of the assessment of curricular and co-curricular activities, the development of infrastructure, and the use of assessment results to inform planning, budgeting, resource allocation, and decision making.

This report identifies transparency within and across divisions to improve the assessment of student learning, resource management, institutional quality, and overall assessment processes.
